# Rector's Message Do Not Be Conformed

As we settle into our summer rhythm, with less church programming and some travel for vacations or family events, it is important to not forget who we are and what we are about. Wherever we may be or do, we need to remember our identity, our purpose, our perspectives, and our priorities.

One of the most helpful scripture passages is 2 Corinthians 5:17: "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come." (NIV). What this passage clearly says is that some kind of change happens when someone believes and decides to follow Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord of his/her life. Some changes may be instant while others may be gradual.

## **A New Identity**

The first change that happens when we believe and accept Jesus as Savior and Lord of our lives is our identity. St. John clearly tells us that "All who received him, to those who believed in his name; he gave the right to become children of God." (John 1:12). Some will obviously argue that since we are all created in the image of God, we are children of God regardless of whether or what we believe. In a way they are right, but not in the sense that St. John and the apostles understood it. It is very true that God loves all humanity. The problem is that sin has estranged humanity from God. Through faith in Jesus the Christ, we are reconciled to God and restored to that original status as God's children; not just his creatures.

## **A New Purpose**

The second change that happens is our purpose for being. St. Paul referring to the change that occurs says that "All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation..." (2 Cor. 5:18). Peter puts it even more beautifully: "But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light." (1 Peter 2:9). Once we are in Christ, we no longer live for ourselves alone but for God and his purposes in the world.

## **A New Perspective**

With a new identity and a new purpose, a new perspective begins to emerge. We begin to look at ourselves and others not from a worldly point of view (2 Cor. 5:16), but from Christ's point of view. Unfortunately, this change is often slower than one would wish. Indeed that's why many non-Christians accuse Christians of hypocrisy. Our perspectives are often very far from Christ's perspective and very much like everyone else's. We need to examine our perspectives and our attitudes to ensure that they are consistent with our new identity and purpose.

#### **New Priorities**

With a new understanding of who we are and what we are about, it should be obvious that our priorities would also change. This is true for many Christians but certainly not all. The way we spend our money, time, and any other resources God has blessed us with does not always reflect who we claim to be. Our priorities should reflect our love for God and one another.

During this summer season, may we be careful not to be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of our minds, so that we may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. (Romans 12:2). Whatever context we find ourselves in, may we strive to be salt and light. (Matthew 5:13-16).

## Senior Warden's Report



The Invite Welcome and Connect ministry, led by Judy Gygi, is thrilled to announce the date and our esteemed guest speakers for the presentation of the Episcopal Churches'

newly envisioned Invite Welcome and Connect program. Join us on Saturday, November 15, 2025, as we welcome Cynthia Brust, the Rector of Christ Episcopal Church in

Melbourne, Florida, to share valuable insights and expertise. This innovative program is meticulously designed to equip our church with specialized tools that will empower us to engage in the profound work of evangelism. I highly encourage you to secure your spot for this pivotal presentation.

Last month, I provided you with an update on the review conducted by the Vestry regarding the 2025 Vestry Diocesan Training Material. Based on the findings of this study, your Vestry has developed a prioritized list of over 30 action items, and Vestry member work has already begun to yield positive results.

- Following the advice of the Church Insurance Agent, the recommendation of the Finance Committee, and the approval of our Vestry, we have increased our church's insurance policy deductible, resulting in an annual insurance premium reduction of \$897.00.
- Other financial initiatives include moving a portion of our church funds into a secure, higher-return account.
- On the administrative side, our Ministry Manual is in the process of being updated and refined to provide the parish easier access and understanding of each ministry role and responsibilities.

• The other thing you may have noticed was the introduction of a Welcome Table in the parish hall. The focus of this initiative is on guests/newcomers being greeted by vestry members who will respond to what information guests/newcomers may want about the church by providing handouts and materials in response to their needs on the first couple of visits.

Although there is no formal Vestry meeting scheduled for the month of July, with God's inspiration and help, our work will continue on our 2025 Diocesan Vestry Training action item list this summer.

All your ministry teams and Vestry members are dedicated to serving Christ. Their meetings provide opportunities for you to personally connect with your fellow parishioners and foster a stronger bond within the church. We would be honored and delighted if you could consider attending any of these meetings and providing your input. ## Ministry Spotlight: Buildings & Grounds

I've always loved exploring old churches and graveyards. Even as a young child, such holy spots drew me so surely that avoiding their call left a pain in my heart. Even old Antebellum ghosts of churches buried deep in the woods.

So of course, I could not deny the call to worship at Holy Trinity Church. The crisp, white building with its steep roof and red doors sent out an undeniable welcome. I would soon discover this was matched by the charisma of the parishioners who filled the pews every Sunday.

Such purity as is found at our church and grounds requires constant and faithful up-keep. Those called to this ministry are often unsung heroes. I'm a cradle Episcopalian, but I never knew that the responsibility for the church building and grounds was a duty given to the vestry's Junior Warden. We are blessed with Steve Knowles serving us in that role. His family has a long rich history at Holy Trinity — in fact, ancestors of his are among the church's founders. Some are buried in the graveyard beside the church.

Of his duties, Steve says, "This is labor of love. I approach my duties with whatever time and effort is needed."



## **Prayer Lists**

Prayer is the primary way we express our love & concern for one another. Our clergy & Pastoral care team are eager to pray for anyone in need. We maintain two prayer lists: Urgent & Long-Term Needs. The Urgent List is for people going through a crisis moment in their lives such as hospitalization, life-threatening diagnosis, death in the family, etc. The Long-term list is for those who are getting better but still facing challenges related to illness or other adversity. Names on the urgent list are included in the Sunday morning Prayers of the People, while names on both lists are prayed for by name at the Wednesday Healing Service and by individual intercessors. Responsibility for maintaining such a robust intercessory prayer list requires regular review and updates. Gisselle is maintaining a spread sheet with the names being prayed for, names of those submitting prayer requests, and date names were submitted. When appropriate, we would love to know the reason someone is being added to the prayer list so we may know what to pray for. We wish to review and update the lists monthly. If we do not receive updates, names on the urgent list will be moved to the longterm list automatically after one month.
