# **Rector's Message**

# Striving to be a Vital Church

In my reflection last month, I invited all of you to participate in our Back to Church



season here at Holy Trinity. I stated that our Back to Church season would involve activities aimed at encouraging, equipping, and providing opportunities for us to be more intentional about inviting, welcoming, and connecting others to God and one another. I also encouraged everyone to fill out a Parish Vitality Survey to give us more information on where we are as a congregation.

As I write this month's reflection, I am delighted to report that the survey was completed, analyzed, and the results presented to the congregation at an open forum on Sunday September 28. The results from the survey present a picture of a relatively stable congregation with several areas that need increased attention. The survey results

clearly show areas of strengths and weaknesses, opportunities and threats. Before the results were presented to the congregation, they were carefully reviewed and analyzed by the Vestry as part of our Mutual Ministry Review held at a day long retreat on Saturday September 20. Among the resources we used to analyze the survey results was an article by the Rev. Bob Honeychurch, that defines a vital congregation is a community of faith which:

- Invites people to become passionate followers of Jesus Christ
- > Creates opportunities for personal and corporate transformation
- Equips and empowers people for gospel mission in the world

We also used a document from an organization called Natural Church development that presents **8 Characteristics (Qualities ) of Healthy Growing Churches as** Empowering Leadership, Gift-Based Ministry, Passionate Spirituality, Effective (Functional) Structures, Inspiring Worship, Holistic Small Groups, Need-Oriented Evangelism, & Loving Relationships.

While we are encouraged by how our survey results align with the standards outlined in the above documents, we acknowledge that we still have more work to sustain and grow in vitality. It is in this regard that we are continuing to work tirelessly to encourage, equip, and provide opportunities for every one of you to participate in this effort. I wish to specifically encourage you to prayerfully consider how you may participate in the upcoming events including the Blessing of Animals on October 4, the Ministry Fair of October 12, the Golf Benefit on October 20, and the InviteWelcomeConnect training on November 15. This is also an opportunity to invite your unchurched friends to "Come and See."

In essence the Back to Church season at Holy Trinity has begun and promises to be both exciting and challenging as we strive to become a truly vital church. We are confident that God who began a good work among us, will carry it on to completion on the day of Christ Jesus (Philippians 1:6).

# Senior Warden's Report

The work on the parish rectory continues. Unfortunately, the scope of the repairs necessary to return the rectory to a habitable



condition goes beyond just the water damaged. Simply stated, the rectory is showing its age. Fr. Samuel and our JR. Warden, Steve Knowles, have been working very closely with con-

tractors and our church insurance company in this effort. Unfortunately, Fr. Samuel and his family have not been able to return home to the rectory yet and are still living in Airbnb accommodations.

In the meantime, our plans are still on track for the presentation of the Episcopal Churches' newly envisioned Invite Welcome, Connect program. Join us on Saturday, Nov. 15, 2025, as we welcome Cynthia Brust, the Rector of Christ Episcopal Church in Melbourne, FL, to share valuable insights and expertise. I highly encourage you to secure your spot for this pivotal presentation. Contact Gisselle in the church office at (352) 787-1500 to reserve your spot.

Our Director of Music, Sharon Redding, has been collaborating with a donor who has generously funded the purchase and installation of a new sound system for our church. We have started the installation phase of our new sound system. By the time you read this, the installation should be completed. Be ready to experience the upgrade to our system in the near future.

Last month, I mentioned the purchase of a white mini bus by the school in support of the newly introduced transition program. (This program aims to assist high school graduates in navigating the job market and transitioning into adulthood.) This new program, in fact, is now up and operating; unfortunately, the white mini bus is not; the engine failed and is in the process of being replaced.

I also want to mention the September 20, 2025 Vestry retreat and let you know that your Vestry did an outstanding job reviewing the Parish Vitality survey results, considering how well our clergy and lay leadership (including the Vestry) is fulfilling their responsibilities to each other and the broader parish. Based on our review, we were able to recognize opportunities for improved collaboration and clearer future direction. Where critical comments were found, and there were a few, we worked hard to identify solutions, focusing on fixing the problem, not the blame. Where we found encouraging comments, we saw these as an opportunity to build on a solid foundation, not resting on our laurels. We asked ourselves what's the next step, how can we build on the resources and talents of our church?

All your ministry teams and Vestry members are dedicated to serving Christ. Their meetings provide opportunities for you to

personally connect with your fellow parishioners and foster a stronger bond within the church. We would be honored and delighted if you could consider attending any of these meetings and providing your input. 



#### Vestry Meeting/Retreat Highlights-September 20, 2025

The Vestry met for their Annual Retreat and monthly meeting on Saturday, September 20, 2025, to discuss matters of importance to the life and mission of our church.

The meeting began with Morning Prayer led by Fr. Samuel.

- 1. Rectory update:
  - \* All mold issues, at the Rectory, have been resolved and signed off on.
  - \* The rebuilding process has begun, but is estimated to take longer than planned.
  - \* Insurance is covering housing for Fr. Samuel and his family.
- 2. The Vestry reviewed and approved proposed changes to the School Board Policies and Procedures.

Fr. Samuel began the Retreat with a handout of the Mutual Ministry Review. The purpose and Key Aspects of the Process were discussed giving the Vestry a clear understanding of reason for the Vitality Survey and how to approach the results of the survey. From the survey we are looking for the strengths and weaknesses of our church as viewed by our parishioners. It is not intended for blame, but rather to understand and address the views, good or bad.

Fr. Samuel provided an article on Vital Congregations. According to the Rev. Bob Honey-church, a vital congregation is a community of faith which:

- Invites people to become passionate followers of Jesus Christ
- Creates opportunities for personal and corporate transformation
- Equips and empowers people for gospel mission in the world

With the guidance of Fr. Samuel, we then discussed the 8 Essential Qualities of Healthy Growing Churches. They include Empowering Leadership, Gift-Based Ministry, Passionate Spirituality, Effective (Functional) Structures, Inspiring Worship, Holistic Small Groups, Need-Oriented Evangelism and Loving Relationships. As we looked at each of the characteristics, we felt that we are heading in the right direction as those qualities can be found right here at Holy Trinity.

The 2025 Parish Vitality Survey Results were reviewed and discussed, at length. Overall, we were pleased with the results. For example, 90% of the parishioners were pleased with the quality of worship. We are aware of areas that our parishioners feel need attention and all concerns, fixable or not, will be addressed. We will look at Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats as we discern the next steps.

Our afternoon ended with a prayer from Fr. Samuel.
