

# Rector's Message Alleluia! Give thanks to the risen Lord!

One of the great joys of the Easter Season is the ability to say and sing Alleluia and not have to apologize for it. During Eastertide, all controversies around the appropriate use of "Alleluia" are suspended.

It is one thing to say or sing Alleluia because it is written in a prayer or hymn and another to say it from a heart full of praise. The word "Alleluia" is translated "Praise the Lord." In that case, I have every reason to praise the Lord.

First, I praise the Lord for our church family. The dedication, the love, the grace, and generosity of so many of you is reason not to just say but shout Alleluia! This was once again demonstrated during the whole season of Lent as we embarked on so many aspects of our shared life and mission.

Secondly, I praise God for His faithfulness. Throughout Lent we reflected on scriptures that emphasized God's promise of hope and healing to a hurting world. In many cases, we saw God's hand at work in our own lives. ## Senior Warden's Report



Let me begin with a gentle reminder to RSVP by Friday, May 9, 2025, for our May 19, 2025, Light The Path Banquet & Benefit to

celebrate the guiding lights that set our students on a brighter path. Admission to the banquet includes dinner for just \$40. Whether or not you can attend, please consider making a donation to Holy Trinity Episcopal School, which is specifically designed to meet the needs of our students in grades 6 -12 who experience learning differences related to Autism, ADHD, Dyslexia, and other learning disabilities.

This month, instead of our regular Vestry meeting on April 24, our Head of the School Board, Dan Curtis, suggested that it would be a good time to have a combined meeting of the School Board and Vestry, especially with new Vestry Leadership and a newly hired Head of School, Rebecca Coulter. And indeed it was, starting right off with introductions all the way around the meeting room. I believe I speak for the entire Vestry in saying we were all very impressed with Rebecca. She has extensive educational

experience and will be an outstanding fit in her new demanding role.

Last month, I mentioned the Invite Welcome and Connect (IWC) ministry led by Judy Gygi was scheduled to have a meeting on March 4, 2025. Well, I was able to attend this very informative gathering. The primary focus of this meeting was to discuss how to plan the rollout of The Episcopal Churches newly envisioned Invite Welcome Connect program at Holy Trinity. The new IWC program equips our church with tools that are specifically designed to assist Episcopalians in engaging in the profound work of evangelism. This ministry's next meeting is scheduled for this coming Friday, May 2, 2025, at 10:00 - 11:30 a.m. in the Grace Chapel.

Although we did not have our regular April Vestry meeting, that doesn't mean that the work on the diocesan Vestry Training topics has not continued, and in fact, progress has been made on several fronts. The training covered a wide range of topics of vital importance to the Episcopal Church, including subjects such as:

- Church Size and Dynamics: The Impact on Size, Leadership, Culture, Growth, and Conflict
- Designing with Purpose: Simplifying Social Media and Website Strategies for Your Church
- From Headwinds to Full Sail: Being a Courageous Church in Uncertain Times
- From Surviving to Thriving: Casting Vision and Leading From the Front
- Investment and Cash Management
- Risk Management and Insurance Basics

Maundy Thursday Agape Meal



I love the way Holy Week begins; ours at Holy Trinity began in the courtyard – with the waving of the palms. Our mood was celebratory, a welcome change from the austerity, the self-made deprivations of Lent.

Jesus and his disciples strode triumphantly into Jerusalem that first Palm Sunday. He chose two of his disciples to go ahead of the others. He instructed them to find a donkey to carry him into the city. Likewise, two of his disciples were enlisted with procuring a room for the Passover celebration. In the early church this would become an agape meal, a love feast intended to boost community. You might say the Passover meal Jesus presided over began as such a love feast. It became a

tradition in the early church to share a meal before the celebration of Holy Eucharist. And while the Eucharist itself would consist of bread and wine, the meal leading up to it provided food to quell the appetites of the hungry faithful.



The agape meal was a frequent occurrence in the early church. And once again, it's celebrated today. The intent now, as in the early church, is to draw people into fellowship, harmony, and good will.

Traditionally, agape meals were simple. Our meal at Holy Trinity included foods that might have been found on early Christian tables.

When Holy Trinity disciples – yes, we can consider ourselves as modern-day disciples – arrived for our own feast of love, we found the door to the Parish Hall closed. Upon opening it, we were greeted with a darkened room. Profuse tea lights glittered on each of

the tables. Pitchers of wine and water likewise awaited us. A wine goblet and beverage glass completed each place setting. The tables also bore platters of food: pita bread representing the Passover unleaded bread, hummus, grapes, dates, nuts, and cheeses. Servers brought meal-goers bowls of lentil soup. Conversations were cordial and subdued. I think it's safe to say we each felt ourselves to be a part of something central to the church. We felt ourselves to be participants of the Last Supper.

The agape meal concluded with a foot washing. Volunteers submitted to having their feet washed by Father Samuel or a fellow congregant. Others sang.

With the meal finished, we proceeded to the sanctuary for Holy Eucharist and the stripping of the altar. With that the evening ended. We left in silence, knowing that the meal we had participated in brought us closer together. United and humble, the meal indeed brought us closer together, in awe of our Lord who surrendered his will, his life so that we could join him with our Father in his kingdom.
