Senior Warden's Message

Greetings my fellow parishioners and friends. Hard to believe that it is March already, seems like we just celebrated a new year and election of 4 new Vestry members. Sometimes this can result in a slow down until everyone gets acquainted, but this group has all hit the ground running and I am very excited about what may be accomplished this year and beyond.

This past week our Vestry and Fr. Greg took time out to spend a full day and a half at a Vestry retreat at the Diocese of Central Florida's Canterbury Retreat and Conference Center in Oviedo. We had very productive and reflective sessions and returned with a deepened appreciation for each other as well as decisions and plans that we feel strongly will help guide Holy Trinity in the future.

During the retreat we finalized our Vestry organization and Team leadership responsibilities. Randy Siver is our Jr. Warden and heads up the Building and Grounds Team; Barb Cogley is our Parish Life Team Leader; Jim Kelly continues as the School Support Team Leader; Liz Mustin will lead the Christian Education Team as well as the Welcome Team; Dave Aldrich leads the Invite Team as well as the Connect Team (more discussion on the Invite, Welcome, and Connect teams will



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follow); Deb Yee continues as our Communication Team Leader; Mark Welton leads our Finance Team; and, Pat McLaughlin will assist Randy with Building and Grounds special projects. Again, we have a great leadership team and we should all expect an active and successful year in 2020.

Another very significant accomplishment of the retreat was the drafting of a Mission Statement for Holy Trinity. Following much brainstorming and discussion, the Vestry and Fr. Greg "drafted" the following statement of our mission as well as details of how we fulfill our mission.

Draft - Holy Trinity Episcopal Church Mission Statement:

We are a warmly welcoming church family that

experiences God's presence through worship and fellowship. We glorify Him in all that we do and share his love through outreach and service.

How We Fulfill Our Mission:

1. Invite, welcome, and connect with those seeking a church family.
2. Provide purpose to parishioners sharing gifts to serve Christ
3. Actively participate in the larger faith community working together to serve those in need.
4. Holy Trinity Episcopal School offers transformative faith-based education to students with learning differences in Grades 6 through 12. This is our primary Ministry.

A mission statement is important for any organization, including churches, to answer "What are we here to do?" Without a clear statement, leadership can often lose sight of its direction and can become purely reactive. We intend to make our Mission a living statement, a constant reminder of the "work we have been given to do" and how we do it. You will be seeing and hearing much more about our Mission statement in our communications, documents, and bulletins.

Much of our retreat time was spent reviewing and discussing a ministry that has been developed through actual experiences in various Episcopal churches. This ministry, "Invite, Welcome, and Connect", resides as a ministry program in the School of Theology of the University of the South in Sewanee, TN.

A statement in the Introduction of the *Invite, Welcome, Connect* book states:


"For a congregation to thrive - spiritually and numerically - we need more than a newcomer ministry. For us to live into God's call to share the good news of Christ far and wide, to serve the poor, and to love our neighbors, we need a ministry that is deeper and wider than we have imagined, that not only invites and welcomes

visitors but also works to fully incorporate them into the body of Christ".

We believe this ministry is the best next step for our church to take as we continue to grow and develop as a church family. There will be three Vestry led Teams (Invite, Welcome, Connect) that will work to implement new and creative ways to invite those seeking a church family, welcome them warmly and completely, and then connect them deeply in our ministries, providing them the opportunity to find purpose and share their gifts. Obviously, we are in the incubation stage of this ministry. We will be expanding teams and learning more about the details of how this process works. Expect to see more information each month as we grow and develop this new ministry.

Early Christians observed a season of penitence and fasting in preparation for the Paschal feast, or Pascha. The season now known as Lent (from an Old English word meaning "spring," the time of lengthening days) has a long history. Originally, in places where Pascha was celebrated on a Sunday, the Paschal feast followed a fast of up to two days. In the third century this fast was lengthened to six days. Eventually this fast became attached to, or overlapped, another fast of forty days, in imitation of Christ's fasting in the wilderness. The forty-day fast was especially important for converts to the faith who were preparing for baptism.

In the western church the forty days of Lent extend from Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday, omitting Sundays. The last three days of Lent are the sacred Triduum of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Today Lent has reacquired its significance as the final preparation of adult candidates for baptism.

Joining with them, all Christians are invited "to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word" (BCP, p. 265).

Vestry Minutes

February 17, 2020

Present: Rev. Dr. Greg Wilde, Rector; Dan Curtis, Sr. Warden; Randy Siver, Jr. Warden; Pat McLaughlin; Deb Yee; David Aldrich; Liz Mustin; Jim Kelly; Barbara Cogley.

Guests: Russ Casson, Treasurer; Peggy Barry, church admin/bookkeeper; Justin McCallister, Interim Head of School

The Rev. Dr. Greg opened the meeting with prayer.

School Update: Justin McCallister discussed the VR program for the students and that 3 of our students have been approved for the culinary arts program and have received funds to help with attending the program from the state scholarship program. He also discussed school safety as there has been an increase in unidentified individuals walking through the campus. The need for increased signage to identify the school was discussed and the Jr. Warden will follow through with the need.

Pilot reading program has been delayed because of delay with delivery of the materials for the program.

There are 5 potential new 6th graders for next school year.

School Support Team: Jim Kelly reviewed the proposal completed by Terry Osborn regarding Growth of the School. The plan was accepted by the School Support Team.

He also discussed the phone at the school was not always answered by a human voice and messages were left on voice mail. They decided

to address the issue by developing a plan for a volunteer program to have someone to answer the phone when the secretary is not at school, as Justin is students or teachers at various times and not available to answer the phone. This is especially needed for parent calls, new students inquiries and emergency situations.

Jim also stated that the Salvation Army has invited all who volunteer serving breakfasts and the bell ringers to an appreciation event.

School and Church Financials: Russ Casson—

School-- expenses in January exceeded income as expected; the next McKay Scholarship funding is expected in February. Year to date School expenditures have not exceeded income. Church--- January is the first month of the year and Pledge receipts were slightly short of budget. January recorded three payrolls (this happens twice a year) and this exceeded the average monthly payroll budget. Also, the maintenance budget was exceeded because a significant expenditure was made to the contractor on the window project.

Other Team Updates:

Christian Education—Liz Mustin—The education committee met and discussed the upcoming Sunday series. This committee meets approximately three times a year. The current series presented by Randy Siver will end March 8. Gary Sligh will lead the class on World Religion from 3-15 to 4-19. There will not be a class on Easter Sunday. Next class will be "If you want to walk on water, you have to get out of the boat", followed by "Jesus, God knows your name." This will take the class thru July.

Communications—Deb Yee stated that the Website continues to have some difficulty with the church calendar and the developers are working to resolve the issue. Also, work is being done to include membership, funeral, and wedding information on the site. Also request for prayers are available on site, however, the email linked to this request needs to be determined. Discussion ensued as to whether we should include birthdays and anniversary on this

site. It was decided to add these items to a month without the dates.

Deb reported on the ECW meeting and noted that Nancy Mitchell was presented with a certificate and flowers for her work as Vice President of Programs for ECW for the past year. She reported that the ECW voted to purchase two items on the School's needs list and a wall mounted brochure holder for the parish hall. This will eliminate the clutter on one table.

The books on the table in the parish hall were discussed and if all were appropriate and if the parishioners know that this is a lending library and they are welcome to use the books. It was decided that the book issue will be addressed by the Parish Life team.

She reminded all of the Fruitland Park Day and that we have a booth for the day. She is still in need of volunteers to man the booth for 2 hour periods that day. The date is Saturday 3-28-20 – 9am to 3 pm.

Membership – Dave Aldrich

Dave informed us that the Men's Club Trivia event had 65 people attend and that a profit of \$125 was the result. The money will be donated to the school.

Shove Tuesday was discussed and the Men's Club will make the pancakes and sausage. This event is scheduled for 2-24 from 5:30 to 7 pm. Peggy noted the men will have to clean up the fellowship hall and take out the garbage as the school will be using the room the following morning.

Membership committee has completed the Invite post cards and they will be mailed to the newer areas in the Villages to make the new homeowners aware of our church.

Newcomers plan to start a guest book for visitors to sign at the entrance to the church. They plan to have a greeter at each service. After each visitor is asked to sign the guest book, they will be offered a new booklet, "What to Expect at an Episcopal Church Service". Members of the committee will possibly start welcoming guests

during the service. The committee is also having business cards made with church information to hand out to individuals in the community.

Parish Life—Barbara Cogley

A Hospitality meeting is in the process of being planned by Janet Callahan, the committee consists of 7 ladies who have volunteered to help via the pledge campaign. They will develop plans to host the Sunday after service social time.

A yard sale that was originally slated for March has been postponed and plans for a possible yard sale at a later date this year is in the planning stage. The ECW, Men's Club and school will be contacted to help plan this event.

Plans for dinner groups were discussed and will be pursued.

Finance—Mark Welton is out of town and e-mailed a report. He noted that the window subscriber concept was finalized and a notice was in Sunday 2-26 bulletin. The Planned Giving campaign will gear up with some announcements in church soon, including reference to brochures now in the parish hall. Also, soon we will add Planned Giving to our website.

Resolution was made by Randy Siver to give the Ash Wednesday plate offering to Esther House and the Good Friday offering to Diocese of Jerusalem. Second by Dave Aldrich and passed.

Building and Grounds—

Randy stated that one window has been removed and is the process of repair. Maintenance team worked on removing paint from all windows and they can now be opened. The antique brass handles and hinges are in place, some need replacement and Randy and Pat are in search of these devices. Need to investigate how to get paint of window frames and will ask sexton to help. We had some shingles flying loose on the south side of the church. Roofer was contacted. They had been blown lose by wind and cut in half; the area was covered to prevent any leaks. Some power washing needs to be done and a parent of a student will do areas identified. He

will also be asked to spread dirt mounded in cemetery yard. Signage to the church was discussed and Randy and Pat will follow thru with checking out signs on 468, 466A, front of church sign and replace as needed.

Two stained glass windows have been put up in parish hall and 2 more will be added.

Old Business—

Vestry Retreat is scheduled for 2-25 and 2-26. Eight vestry members will attend.

Father Greg ended the meeting with prayer. Meeting adjourned at 9:15 PM.

HTEC Endowment is Now Active

Several months ago we reported that HTEC was in the process of establishing a Planned Giving Program – an Endowment - for the long-term financial health and mission of our church. I am happy to report now that our program is in place! In the coming weeks you will hear more about this program – a new name with much more information.

For the moment a few facts:

What is planned giving? It is an opportunity for anyone who wishes to include our church in their will and estate plan (or even make a lifetime gift) that will be part of a lasting endowment, the income from which will be used for the long-term mission and growth of our church. It is not a substitute for pledges or other contributions to the day-to-day operations of the church. Like endowments at colleges and other organizations, it is a financial resource that is invested and preserved, with income used for the long-term growth and mission of the church. The resources in our endowment, like those of many other churches with such programs, will be managed by the Episcopal Church Foundation, and supervised here by our Planned Giving Committee and Vestry. Our endowment is governed by Florida law to ensure that it is managed and used carefully and wisely.

We now have brochures and pamphlets available in the parish hall that will give you more information. You may talk to Mark Welton, the Planned Giving “Shepherd” for the program, or any of our Endowment Committee members: Parker Bauer, Mike Browne, and

Holy Trinity School Update School Support Team

Dyslexia Pilot Program Material and Tutors update: We have suffered several setbacks.

First, one of the two tutors we had lined up for the pilot program has withdrawn her name. Second, receipt of program material from the publisher has been delayed with the explanation that the material is going through an update and is scheduled to ship by the end of February. This delay has unfortunately taken the school past its' planned window of opportunity and consequently the decision was made to postpone the kickoff of the pilot program until the beginning of the 20-21 school year.

Kaleidoscope Profile Assessment: Due to the Dyslexia Pilot Program roll back, the Kaleidoscope Profile for the teachers and students has likewise been pushed back to the 20-21 school year.

HTES Growth Plan proposal Power Point presentation by Terry Osborn: "How to Grow Holy Trinity School": Outstanding work and presentation of a plan to increase our student population was enthusiastically viewed and accepted. Next step in our action plan is to compose a package for presentation to potential sources of students for our school. A sub team has been formed to put this proposed package together and then go on a recruiting campaign for people to present this material.

School Phone System Management: Due to limited staffing, the school has had to rely on voice mail to capture some incoming phone calls. Several volunteers are needed to alleviate this situation. So far one individual has been identified. This is a first step in a plan

to have a group of volunteers available to answer school office phones whenever needed.


