Sr. Warden's Message

Greetings my friends, I write this on the eve of the election; one more thing we pray will conclude quickly. What a year this has been, the pandemic has caused so many changes in our lives and especially in our church. Fortunately, we have been able to find ways to still worship and provide opportunities for some of you to reengage in church activities. There are actually a lot of activities going on that you may not be aware of but that certainly demonstrate that Holy Trinity is alive and well and moving forward. Following are summaries of some of the activities and projects:

Annual Blackston/Holy Trinity Golf

Fundraiser: You will see details from Sid, but I want to thank Sid Yee and the entire group of volunteers that pulled it off in a very difficult year. Considering the limitations created by the virus it was very well done and it was great to see so many Holy Trinity friends again. Thank you, Sid and your Team...... Great Job!!

Search for new Rector: Six candidates have been interviewed (on Zoom) as of last week. Second round (Zoom) interviews are scheduled for this week. We have all been very encouraged by the quality of candidates that we have spoken with. We are confident that the priorities you

identified for a new priest in the parish survey will be fulfilled. The Committee has established a set of standardized questions, derived from the survey, that we ask of each candidate.

All parishioners will receive via hotline email a Parish Survey Summary which provides the survey results (and data) and your desires for a new priest.

Worship Services: The 10:30 Sunday service continues to go well and has been at capacity (30 attendees) the last couple of weeks. As a result, plans are in the works to start a second service. The second, earlier service, will be held in the Parish Hall at 9am and will begin on November 22nd. This service will be at 9am rather than 8am to accommodate the travel and

schedules of our Supply Priests. It will be held in the Parish Hall because there is not time for sanitizing the church between services and because the earlier service will not have music. We wish both could be held in the church but that is not possible at this point.

Rev. Janice has continued to conduct the 11:30am Wednesday Healing and Holy Eucharist services and now on Tuesday's at 11am Rev. Jonathan Hole is conducting a Prayer Meeting in the Quaker tradition in the Church.

A big thanks to our clergy, Altar Guild, Lectors, Ushers, Church Administrator, Music Director, and technical support. It is wonderful that many can worship together again, albeit in limited numbers.

Parish Hall Refurbishment: Barb Cogley, Parish Life, has headed a group of volunteers that have developed ideas and plans for refurbishing the Parish Hall. They have come up with great ideas for organizing our literature, providing a dedicated area for the school to highlight their activities and students, a wall mounted smart TV for showing photo slideshows of church and school activities and live streaming services, and additional ways to illustrate our pride in the history of Holy Trinity. They are bringing new life to our spiritual community's Hall. I am sure you will all enjoy the improvements when you next have a chance to visit the church or campus.



Preparation for our new Rector: Randy Siver, Bob Mustin, and our Sexton have been working hard to prepare the Rector's office and Rectory for our new priest. The office has been repainted, a new floor has

installed, and some of the bookcases have been removed. As a result, the office is considerably brighter and more spacious, and should be much appreciated by our new Rector. General yardwork, cleaning of gutters and such has been accomplished at the rectory. Wonderful job, Randy and Bob.

Another project initiated in preparation for our rector is establishing by-laws for our school. These by-laws will define how the school is governed by a school board. How the school is governed has never been defined in the past and we have a mix of different organizations. This will establish a structure that clearly defines responsibilities of School Board, Vestry, Rector, and Head of School, something we thought important to establish for our new rector. Thanks to Sara May, Terry Osborn, and Jim Kelly for all your hard work on this important project.

Stewardship: As of this writing, 62 parishioners have submitted pledges for 2021. Please, submit your pledge cards as soon as you can. And, if you are behind in your pledge commitment for 2020 please do what you can to try to catch up.

I have not covered all the various projects, activities, and ministries that many of you are currently involved in; I simply wanted to highlight some of the activities, to thank those involved, and to communicate *to all of you* that there is still much going on in our church, even when it may appear there is not. With many generous people sharing their talents for the betterment of all of us, we are truly blessed to be part of this wonderful church.

Our 2021 Stewardship Campaign A Message from Charlie Kraft


Dear Fellow Parishioners:

VESTRY MEETING MINUTES

October 19, 2020 6:30 pm in person

Present: Dan Curtis, Jim Kelly, Mark Welton, Deb Yee, David Aldrich, Liz Mustin, Randy Siver, Sara May, Russ Casson, Justin McCallister, Peggy Barry and Barbara Cogley. The meeting opened at 6:30 PM with prayer by Randy Siver.

Holy Trinity School—Justin McCallister

Tutor Program—there has been an increase in the number of potential tutors who are interested in HTES. We have tutors with experience in teaching math, science, reading, and writing. Jim Kelly and Justin McCallister have begun the process of screening the tutors and will begin virtual/phone interviews in the coming weeks.

Students and Families—HTES has continued virtual learning into the second quarter. Grades have improved greatly since March and we hope to see continued moving forward.

Finances—September has seen the distribution of McKay and Step-up scholarships. We expect to see Gardiner Scholarship distribution in October; the funds for the Gardiner have not been released.

School Support Team—Jim Kelly

Although the decision not to start the tutoring sessions until January 2021 has been made by Head of School, Justin McCallister, the effort to recruit one tutor for every student is under way. The initial response to a Tutor search ad in the Villages Daily Sun, composed and submitted by Deb Yee, has been outstanding; a group of thirty (30) people, both in and outside the Villages have volunteered to tutor at our school. Their names and contact information have been provided to Justin. Volunteers have been asked to complete and submit the school's Potential Tutor Application form. The screening process will undoubtedly bring the number down, but this is nonetheless a very good start and speaks positively for the community we live and practice our faith in,

Many thanks to Deb Yee and her contact at the Villages Daily Sun James Dinan for making this happen.

Holy Trinity Salvation Army Breakfast Service team—Jim Kelly

Our service team resumed our designated second Tuesday of the month breakfast at the Leesburg Salvation Army post last week. Sid Yee, Val Tuller, and Jim Kelly prepared the meals for 24 homeless and needy people on Tuesday morning October 13, 2020. Due to COVID 19, the breakfast service process has been radically changed; food is prepared and put in to go containers by our team and delivered by the Salvation Army Staff personnel to patrons waiting outside the building. Patrons do not come into the building and our team never has face to face contact with them. Masks, gloves and disinfectant are the order of the day.

Major Marie Harris has sent us a note thanking us for sharing and what a blessing it is for the partnership between the Salvation Army and HTEC has been.

Also, Jim reported that the School Governance Subcommittee is in the process of developing: by laws for the school, organizational structure that includes a School Board reporting to the Vestry, having the authorities as outlined in Roles and Responsibilities (NAES Best Practice), a clear definition of the roles and responsibilities for the Vestry, Rector, School Board and Head of School, clear definition of communication, planning, leadership transition, and evaluations as outlined in Roles and Responsibilities and recommendation for School Board composition and qualifications as outlined in many of the above documents.

Finance Team— Mark Welton, Russ Casson The financial reports have been reviewed and accepted as present.

The proposed budget for 2021 was reviewed by Mark Welton and Russ. After discussion and adjustments for advertising an newcomers proposed budget Randy made a motion to accept the proposed 2021 budget as adjusted, second by Dan Curtis and unanimously approved by Vestry.

Old Business—

Addition of second service—the Vestry discussed the current service of one at 10:30 and was of the opinion that it was time to add a second service. The additional service would be at 9 am in the Parish Hall. The service would be

moved to 9 am to accommodate our supply clergy, not having to wait 1 and ½ between services. The 9 am service would be without music as before the pandemic. The second service at 10:30 would be with music in the church proper. We have to have services in two areas to ensure a clean environment. Areas where services are held have to be cleaned before a second use of area to comply with CDC guidelines. We continue to maintain social distancing, masks and limit the number of attendees at the services. Our church space enables 30 people seated in a distanced fashion. Individuals will continue to make reservations with church office to attend any of the three services or prayer meeting. The second Sunday service at 9am will begin on November 22, 2020.

Team Updates

Building and Grounds—Randy Siver

Randy is working on a raised garden and the cost is around \$500. He asks why he had to have approval to spend this amount when it is already in his budget. After discussion, Randy made a motion that any dollar amount of \$500 be approved by the Senior Warden, second by Mark Welton and unanimously approved by the Vestry.

The new school signs will be up on Friday October 23, 2020. The Rector office work has been completed. Rectory inside work has been completed and the outside will be finished in a couple of weeks; clean up lawn and finish power washing; plastic brochure holders have been placed and book case for Peggy's papers and forms in place. On the stage, the organ and keyboard will be moved and will check with Justin about the drum set.

Bob Disinger has planned AED and CPR training and has had a good response as to people wanting to attend. He will set a date and proceed. Randy has had a great response to his request for volunteers to help with the inventory that we need for the insurance company, he also will check on the value of the buildings.

The east side of the school building will have the siding replaced. The painting of the church will be done by JR and Son's and will begin on

November 30 and should be completed by December 11.

The window project—Randy has found a new vendor for the windows as the previous vendor could not use the Villages woodshop and has not been able to work since the pandemic. The new vendor will remove the windows and use a single window that will not open and also a different wood which will not warp. The price has increased since we began the project and the current vendor's price is \$4210 per window. Randy will be researching the way to pay for the windows. He will be contacting parishioners who have currently donated \$3000 for a window. If we remove the glass, the cost of each window would be reduced by \$250. Randy will see if it is possible for us to do the window removal.

Communications—Deb Yee

In Person Worship Service—Assisting Rev. Janice with preparations for conducting

Wednesday Healing and HE services outdoors, weather permitting. We found moving the heavy wooden altar in the Chapel to be cumbersome and not practical. After discussion with Rev. Janice, a Vestry member donated a high 4'portable table to serve as a movable altar along with two tablecloths to utilize as covers. Typically, this service has 3 regular attendees; this shorter outdoor service may appeal to those who are not yet ready to return to indoor services.

The new Tuesday 11 AM Prayer Meeting led by the Rev. Jonathan Hole in the sanctuary has been publicized internally with the first gathering set for October 20th. We will begin to share this externally on local social media—in Fruitland Park and The Villages and environs and on the Fruitland Park public bulletin board.

Communications—Daily Sun: Renewed our relationship with the Villages Daily Sun religion reporter (James Dinan) via the assistance of parishioner Jerry Huetz. Mr. Dinan visited our church and school and met with Justin McCallister, Jim Kelly, Jerry Huetz and Deb Yee, including tours of the church and school. Results thus far are: announcement insert on Tutors needed at our School, and an article on the School including tutors need and our upcoming golf tournament. We'll be feeding our

reporter news bits and articles to ensure we're back on publicity track and promoting HTEC and School in newspapers outside of the classifieds.

Deb Yee attended an online Zoom training class offered by the diocese, "Enhancing your Social Media" and gained some best

practices for our Facebook Page.

Equipping parishioners with Zoom capabilities: two informational emails to the parish (the latter including an offer to meet one on one or to instruct over the phone from home) and one in person tutorial were offered this past month. One individual, Pat Topping, attended the in person tutorial on October 14. She now has Zoom on her Smart Phone 7 and has participated in a test Zoom. Deb will publicize offers of training in the Tidings and announce during church services in November. Deb signed up for

a personal Zoom account to initiate meetings and assist parish groups (Christian Ed in particular) who wish to do so.

Clear acrylic communications display racks for brochures, forms and handouts were donated and installed on October 19 to clear floor space, better use vertical space and centralize communications in the Parish Hall.

Parish Life—Barbara Cogley

Barbara reviewed the plans and suggestions developed by the Parish Hall Decorating Committee. The plans include a space for the school to have a display which will be done by the students and be used as a part of their leadership program. Randy will build the type of display board that they want which will be a frame on the wall. The wall at the back of the hall with the Cross will be enhanced either with a painted design or metal décor with a cost of approximately \$100. Nancy and Terry Mitchell along with Jay Summers are working on this project. Diane Casson and Debbie Stanton are working on reviewing the historical pictures that were hanging in the Parish Hall and will hang some and place others in an album. They will also clean and redo the items in the glass enclosed case and make it more attractive.

The committee has recommended the purchase of a smart TV for the Parish Hall which would be used to inform all individuals about our church activities including ECW, Men's group, Bible studies. Adult Christian Ed. choir. upcoming everts and provide livestream worship for overflow from Church services. Also, the school could use the TV for educational programs and events. The total cost for the TV set up is approximately \$1000. The and Vestry committee are currently investigating ways to fund this project.

Randy and his crew have been working many hours to unclutter the Parish Hall and redo the Rector's office and the area is looking much better. Thanks to Randy and all who work with him.

Invite, Welcome, Connect—David Aldrich

David reports that the return to live services is going well and we have completed 6 weeks. Attendance has been close to 30 each week. As far as he knows, no one has been shut out of

services or turned away. He feels that this implies that the vast majority are not comfortable with returning yet. We have to address adding an earlier service in the Parish Hall that would stretch our limited group serving at live services. One benefit of COVID protocols is that we know who is coming, have contact information on everyone and are thus able to welcome and introduce newcomers.

As of October 6, 2020 we have 132 active members, 71 active nonmembers and 49 inactive members.

The numbers are not significantly different than the totals in the last two annual reports. We have had some deaths, some moved away, and we added some newcomers to balance the losses. Peggy is constantly searching old files, emails, etc. to update and correct the database. Eight people left the church as a result of our former rector's departure.

There is no news from the Men's group beyond resuming the monthly Salvation Army breakfast serving in a modified form. I expect that we will be ringing bells for the Salvation Army soon.

Rev. Jonathan Hole will be starting a weekly prayer meeting open to parishioners, friends, neighbors, etc. on Tuesday October 20, 2020. Reservations must be made with Peggy.

The 500 "Invite" postcards that were addressed (and amended) by team members are now being mailed out and that is all the post cards that we have. (front image of post card below) We were originally budgeted \$300 for 2020 as part of the Newcomers budget of \$1500 but that appears to have been cut in the revised budget.



Christian Education—Liz Mustin

Liz reports that the Newcomers Committee has maintained a list of all visitors to HTEC and sent all a letter of welcome. The ushers are doing a good job greeting newcomers at Sunday services and making announcements.

The Christian Ed. Committee has a meeting scheduled to discuss Advent on Zoom session. Also, plans for Christian Ed and Bible Study on Zoom. Ron Wetzel will do first Christian Education to begin on Thursday Oct 29 at 11am titled "If you want to walk on water you have to get out of the boat". Rev. Janice is not able to start Bible Study at this time.

New Business

Christmas Service Plans

Rev. Janice Barnes has proposed a 4pm service on Christmas Eve with streaming to Parish Hall for overflow. We would have communion in the Parish Hall and Church. Possibly have a "drive by" Communion in the church at 5:15pm: walk in front door, communion in the middle of the sanctuary, and exit the side door for those who are not comfortable attending service but would like communion on Christmas Eve. There would be no service on Christmas Day; we will gather for Sunday service on Dec 27 as usual.

The meeting closed with prayer by Randy Siver at 9:25 PM.
