Gratitude and Generosity

Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18).

Last month, I shared my experience and thoughts about the kind of church we are continuously becoming – a warm and

welcoming church for all to belong, become, and bless, in the name of Christ. The more I think about this kind of church, the more I think about the core values that are needed to



nurture and sustain such an environment. Of the many core values, I have in mind Gratitude and Generosity seem to encompass all others. All we need to continue becoming the kind of church God is calling us to be, is to be more grateful and generous people.

Gratitude

The scriptures from both the Old and New Testaments continually remind us of the need to be grateful to God for His goodness to us. Over and over, the Psalmist urges us to give thanks to the Lord for he is good; his love endures forever (Psalm 100:4-5, 107:1, 118:1). St. Paul in almost all his letters also urges us to give thanks always; not only when things are going well but even when things are not going well — in all circumstances. In his letter to the Philippians, he urges us not to be "anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." (Philippians 4:6). This is particularly important because Gratitude has been associated with resilience. In other words, grateful people are more able to cope with life challenges.

Gratitude has also been associated with overall happiness. We also know that, in general, people are attracted to happy people. In other words, the more grateful we are, the happier we will become; and the happier we will become, the more attractive we will be to those who are looking for a spiritual home to belong.

As Christians, we are not only called to express our gratitude to God, but to one another and all those who touch our lives in one way or the other. We ought to give thanks for the gift of each other and for each other's acts of love.

Generosity

Every culture I have had the privilege of living in has had a fundamental belief that the primary and most important way of expressing gratitude is by being generous not only to those who have been generous to us but to others as well. Generosity as an expression of gratitude does not simply reciprocate the goodness but replicates it. It does not simply give back but passes on the love. It is also important to remember that generosity in its true sense is less about material things but more about generosity of spirit – kindness, compassion, forgiveness, presence, etc.

Growing in Gratitude and Generosity

One does not have to look far to see the numerous expressions of gratitude and generosity in our parish family. I see it in word and action – in smiles, in offerings of time, talent, and treasure. My prayer and hope is that we will continue to grow to become even more grateful and generous people.

While this should happen organically, it will also require some intentionality. Our upcoming newcomer gatherings and the Bounce Back Sunday events are some examples of intentional expressions of gratitude and generosity. It is my hope that these events will be opportunities for us to express our thanks to God for all the blessings bestowed upon us, and to one another for the gifts we are to each other.

As I write this brief reflection, I am filled with gratitude to God for the privilege of being part of this wonderful church family; and for each one of you for the gifts you are and bring to our shared life and mission. It is my prayer that the more grateful we become, the more generously we will be able to share the loving, liberating, and life-giving message of God's love in Christ to all who seek a place to belong, become, and bless. Enjoy the rest of your summer.

From the Back Pew



Spring Lake Road was not paved until the early 1960's. Until then it was a dirt road and on Sunday's, parishioners would park along the road in front of the fence and enter through the Lych Gate and into the South door of the Church.

Two large pine trees stood outside the fence just west of the Lych Gate. They had been there for decades and served as a place for parishioners to tie their horse and buggies in the 19th and early 20th Century. Hitching rings were still visible in both trees until they died and were removed in 1989.

The paved road was located closer to the fence to discourage parking except, in order to accommodate the pine trees, the road bends away from the fence before it reaches the curve.

Next month: Has the vacant field next to the School always been vacant?



"This recently discovered, rather idyllic picture is, to my knowledge, the only picture of Spring Lake Road as it once was many decades ago. Holy Trinity's lych gate... is pictured as well as the trees into which hitching rings were attached for those who rode horses to church. Because of lightning and disease, the trees were removed. Unfortunately, none of the hitching rings were preserved. The road, once known as Church Road, is paved."


