#### **Every Perfect Gift**

"Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows."

#### James 1:17

It is that time of the year when we begin to look back with gratitude to the many blessings of our lives, and look forward with anticipation to what

more God has in store for us.



Among this past year's many gifts of which I am grateful is the gift of this family of faith we call Holy Trinity. While there is much I

don't know about the future, I know that our God whose steadfast love never ceases and whose mercies never come to an end will remain faithful to the end. (Lamentations 3:22-23).

One of the common beliefs I have found in every culture I have had the opportunity to live in is that gratitude begets generosity. Grateful people are generous people. Indeed, God's people have

always known that they are blessed in order to be a blessing (Genesis 12:2).

One of the ways we Christians do express our gratitude to God is by offering ourselves (hearts and minds) and portions of God's blessings to us, to be used to His honor and the benefit of others. That is why, every year, we are invited to renew this commitment by prayerfully designating a portion of our financial blessings to be used in support of the church's ministries and mission in our community and beyond.



By now, many of you have received a letter from our stewardship co-chairs, Mark Welton & Pat McLaughlin, informing you of our Annual Stewardship Campaign which officially begins on Sunday October 31 and concludes on Sunday November 21. During this period, we will have opportunities to reflect on the theme "Every Perfect Gift" based on James 1:17 which reminds us that every good and perfect gift comes from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights. We will hear from a variety of people (in person, video, or bulletin inserts) what it means to see our lives and our work as gifts from God and how to respond with gratitude and generosity. In other words, the stewardship campaign is an opportunity to discern how we may each GROW in gratitude and generosity.

A week before the last Sunday of the campaign, you will receive an Estimate of Giving card on which you will indicate how much of your anticipated financial blessings for the coming year you wish to contribute to God's mission at Holy Trinity and beyond. My hope is that whatever you decide will be done willingly and cheerfully, based on your ability. This is particularly important for as St. Paul puts it: "Each of you must give as you have made up

your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Corinthians 9:7).

The last Sunday of the campaign, November 21, will be our Consecration Sunday. We encourage all who are able to bring your Estimate of Giving (Pledge) card to church so you may present it to the Lord as part of your worship experience. We will then pray over the Estimate of Giving cards as we trust God to enable us to fulfill that pledge.

My prayer is that this year's Stewardship Campaign will be for you a loving, liberating, and life-giving experience as you discover that despite the many challenges in our broken world you may be facing, you still have reason to rejoice in the Lord with a heart filled with gratitude and generosity. My hope is that at the end of this period, we will once again join our voices and sing: Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

Dan Curtis made a motion to approve the September Vestry Minutes, second by Sara May, no discussion, unanimously approved.

Randy Siver moved that the treasurer report for September be accepted for audit. Second by Barbara Cogley, open for discussion, no discussion and approved unanimously.

Randy stated that he is looking for vendors for bids for decking at the school. He also stated that the roof lawsuit deposition is scheduled for February 2022. Randy is also meeting with Pat McLaughlin to develop a time line for Gent Construction and the window costs that they submitted.

#### Parish Life- Barbara Cogley

Barbara noted that Annette Freeman and her sister Bonnie Hultin have agreed to have a simple outside coffee hour starting October 24 after the 8 AM service. The tent shades are in place and they will bring out the tables needed and have fellowship and some food following the service and will continue the outside service for the time being. Barbara is looking for individuals to do the 10:30 service and Deb Yee has volunteered to do October 24 and sent out a hot line asking for more volunteers for future Sundays. #### Sr. Warden's Report

Greetings my friends! The season of Thanksgiving and Christmas is fast approaching. Before we get too distracted with holiday preparations, I want to ask you to step back, pause, and pray about several very important upcoming events in the life of Holy Trinity.

Our focused Stewardship Campaign will run during the month of November, culminating the Sunday prior Thanksgiving. You should have received already our Stewardship Co-Chair's letter. You will hear on three successive Sundays from an organization and individuals who will express how your gifts of generosity are transformed to helping many in need in our community. Our parishioners have always responded with generosity when called with a need. While we continue to struggle with this terrible pandemic, our resources are limited and continue to fall short of our needs. Our church does so much good for so many, please pray and consider your ability to be even more generous this next year. As for me, when I recently heard of the Social Security raise in January 2022, my immediate thought was: I can get by without that extra income. There is no reason I cannot give most of this to Holy Trinity and our mission to do His work.

The second very important event I want to mention is the upcoming **Election of New Vestry Members**. This year is especially critical as 6 of the 9 members will be replaced. Speaking from my personal experience, serving Holy Trinity on the Vestry and as Sr. Warden for four years has been challenging, but more so it has been rewarding in myriad ways; I would even say it has been a good investment, my donations

of time, talent, and wealth always yield a great return on what I have given. If you have served on a Vestry (or on a similar board) in the past, or you have a potential interest in serving Holy Trinity as a Vestry member, please pray and give the upcoming election serious consideration. To help those who may have some interest in becoming a candidate or simply want to learn more about the Vestry and its workings, we will offer a "Vestry Overview" meeting on Wednesday evening, November 10th at 6:30pm in the Parish Hall. All parishioners are invited and welcome to attend. The current Vestry will be present to provide an overview of what being on Vestry is about and to answer questions from those in attendance. More information will be coming to you regarding this meeting. In the meantime, PLEASE consider serving your church as a member of the 2022 Vestry.

A few reminders this month for Ushers on their valuable service as we still must practice precautions because of Covid.

When you are serving, please arrive at least 30 minutes before service. This allows time to set out the visitor's book, masks and hand sanitizer. Only the ushers should open and close the doors. Please remember to close the doors once Father Samuel and the LEM have entered the Church. The sun coming in causes issues with the camera.

PLEASE escort parishioners to the appropriate pews BEGINNING with the front pews. (An exception is the Nobles because of Cesar's health). People tend to sit in the back of the Church leaving the front very sparse. One Sunday no one was in the front five pews on the left side. Please follow the seating chart for social distancing. 
#### **Bread and Wine**



The Holy Trinity Church building was completed in 1889 with a bell tower but it did not contain a bell. This tower experienced lightning strikes, housed bats, and became the source of leaks when it rained. As a result, it was removed in the 1920's. The current bell was mounted on the concrete Column at the west entrance in the late 1950's. It is a train locomotive bell acquired and donated By C.O. Rabon who worked for the Seaboard Coast Line in Wildwood. The Rabon family were Active members at Holy Trinity during this time And C.O. daughter-in-law, Sharis, was employed As Church office secretary in the 1960's.
