A Reflection on the Parish Vitality Survey



For the past two weeks, about 40 of you have taken the time to fill out our Parish Vitality Survey. The responses we have received so far have been encouraging in at least two ways:

1. A high level of appreciation for the ministries in which we are engaged.
2. Concerns raised by the respondents are the same ones we have identified in our other conversations.

There two findings are signs of a united faith community with a shared vision and mission. In other words, we share appreciation for the things that are going well and a concern for the things that need improvement.

To give a better picture of what the survey has revealed, below is a table showing how respondents rated the quality of some of our ore ministries with 1 as lowest and 5 as highest:

As you can see from the table above, most of the respondents gave our core ministries a rating of 5 on 5. This is particularly encouraging to those who are committing so many hours to these ministries.

As the table also shows, Fellowship opportunities were rated the lowest which suggests that the respondents are not satisfied with the number of opportunities for fellowship that are being offered. In other words, there are not enough opportunities for people to connect with fellow parishioners. This is something that has come up in many other conversations, and we are already discerning how we may address it. Now that the risk posed by COVID-19 has somehow diminished, we hope to have more fellowship (connecting) opportunities.

Another concern that came mostly through the comment section of the survey is our inability to attract a more diverse demographic. This too is something that has come up very often in our conversations. My view is that while we should continue discerning and doing everything possible to attract, for example, young families with children, we should not be distracted from serving those the Lord has already brought to us. One of the most important ways of overcoming challenges is gratitude. Even as we pray for a

more diverse demographic, we need to be grateful and faithful to who we are now. It might as well be that God's call to us is to serve young families of our community through our school while our worship and other ministries will continue to be primarily to people in their retirement. What matters is that whatever we do will be meaningful and life-giving.

Perhaps one interesting fact of the survey is that even though our Christian Formation (Education) activities received high ratings, they had the least respondents. Our hope is that with the high rating from those who participate, will encourage more people to try them.

Lastly, it is important to note that the 40 responses so far represent less than half of the responses we have received in past surveys. I hope that those who have not had a chance to respond will do so; to make the survey responses more representative of the congregation. We will continue to accept responses until July 10; after which we will create a follow-up survey seeking input on how best to address the concerns raised.

It is truly an honor and privilege for Rose and I to be part of this warm, welcoming, and Christ-centered community where everyone can belong, blossom, and bless. I am particularly

grateful for the acts and words of encouragement I continue to receive; as demonstrated by the comments in the survey. May God continue to give us the courage and grace to invite, welcome, and connect people to Him and to one another in Christ.

I am delighted to inform you that Bishop Brewer has assigned The Rev. Deacon Charlie Perrin to serve as a vocational deacon at Holy Trinity. Deacon Charlie will officially begin his duties at Holy Trinity on Sunday July 3.

According to the Association of Episcopal Deacons,

“A deacon is a baptized person called and empowered by God and the Church to be a model of Christ’s servant ministry for all people. As agents of God’s compassion and reconciling grace, deacons are missionaries to the world and messengers to the Church of the world’s needs, hopes, and concerns. In the Church, deacons call forth, empower and inspire the baptized to respond to these needs. The role of the deacon in liturgy mirrors this role of the deacon in Church and World. Deacons are living symbols of Christ’s presence as they embody Christ’s servant ministry and point to the presence of Christ in those they serve.”

Deacon Charlie served as deacon in the diocese of Long Island for more than 30 years. After his retirement and relocation to Central Florida, he was licensed by Bishop

Brewer to serve in this diocese. Prior to the pandemic, he was assigned to St. James in Leesburg. Deacon Charlie and his wife Angela have been worshipping at Holy Trinity for over a month.

We are grateful to God for bringing Deacon Charlie and Angela to us and look forward to serving the Lord together with gladness and singleness of heart.

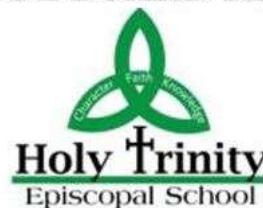

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT



As the school season ended and Board members began summer travel the Board activity has waned a bit. The Board Meeting was held on June 1st, a week early to accommodate travel plans. As the school fiscal year comes to an end on June 30th, I am pleased to report the school will end the year in a positive financial position, due much to the excellent budget management of Justin McCallister, Head of School, and also because state scholarships exceeded the original budget plan. This has allowed us to establish the first ever Capital Budget and plan for improvement. Funds have been approved by the Board for the following:

- Replacement of the AC unit that supplies two older classrooms
- Remodeling/restoration of the office building and walkway

Expansion of the parking lot in a way that will provide two additional lanes for parents to pick up students. This will allow more cars in the queue, assuring no unsafe back up of cars onto

Spring Lake Road, as well as provide a safer more organized way for students to locate parents' cars. This will also provide needed additional parking for church services and events. The Board would like to thank Randy Siver and Neven Matthews for volunteering to complete this project.

The Board continues to work with Justin on completion of a Three-Year Strategic Plan. This document will provide guidance for annual planning, a basis for longer term planning, as well as a complete overview that is needed for grant applications, etc. This document will be completed in time for August Board Meeting. (Board does not meet in July).

The Executive Committee of the Board has been preparing an annual review of our Head of School. The Review will be conducted on Tuesday, June 28th.

In the spring of 1974, the residential developer, Bel-Air Homes, offered to sell at a reduced price the triangular wooded property west of the Church along Spring Lake Road. The Vestry was not financially able to take advantage, but Church member Max Hoffman purchased the property and donated it to the Church with the stipulation that the grounds be landscaped as an outdoor retreat for worship and recreation and as a tribute to Fr Fred Paddock. It became known as Paddock Point. A small gazebo with benches was erected but has since deteriorated and been removed.

Lake County Public Works contacted the Church in 1989 about the traffic problem presented by vehicles exiting the Church parking lot directly onto Spring Lake Road which is on a curve. The County offered to construct an access road on the western side of Paddock Point if the Church would close the exit from the parking lot to Spring Lake Road. The Church agreed and extended the fence on the south side of the parking lot and the new access road, called Marjorie Street, has been used ever since.

Over ten years ago the large monument style sign was installed on Paddock Point. This sign was donated by Dr. Hugh Huston.

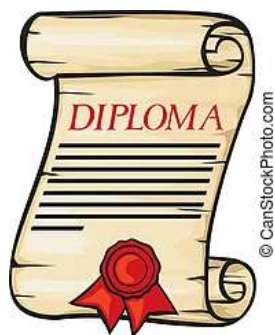
