School Board Report



HTES SENIORS ATTEND COLLEGE

Now that the 2022-23 school year is underway, our HTES students are settling into a routine. New students are acclimating to a new school, new teachers, making new friends, and returning students are reconnecting with teachers and friends. For two seniors this school year also brings a new opportunity. These seniors are taking college courses as dual enrolled students, which means that they are taking college level classes, as well as completing their high school graduation requirements at HTES.

Both students were required to take entrance exams to be accepted to their respective schools, Lake Tech, with locations throughout Lake County, and Lake-Sumter State College, located in Leesburg. As high school students taking college courses, their tuition at these schools is steeply discounted, allowing them to get a head start on their post-secondary education and careers with minimal cost.

Lake Tech offers a variety of technical and career specific certificate courses; our student is enrolled in computer technology. He is on target

to obtain his first certificate in November, and his second certificate just after he graduates from HTES.

LSSC offers a wide array of academic programs ranging from Arts and Humanities to STEM to Business. Our student will be taking general education courses as she works toward an Associate's Degree.

Justin McCallister, Head of School at HTES, commented that he is "incredibly proud of both students", and that their admission to these colleges is a "result of their hard work and attention to their classes" at HTES. It should be mentioned that their college acceptances are also a testament to the dedication of Mr. McCallister and the HTES staff, including their commitment to ensure that each of our students succeeds in reaching their potential.

One of the features of Holy Trinity Church is the lych (rhymes with ditch) gate that is located at the south entrance to the church yard facing Spring Lake Road. It was erected in 1889 from funds donated by Emily Tatham.

Although lych gates are often found in Anglican churchyards in Europe, they are fairly rare in the United States. The purpose of a lych gate is to provide a resting place for the casket and pall bearers before the priest arrives to accompany the funeral procession into the church. Currently, it is common for prayers to be said with the family before the procession.

The lych gate is cited as part of Holy Trinity's placement on the National Register of Historic Places in 1975. In 2011, the Timucua Chapter of Colonial Dames XVII Century erected a plaque as part of an historic marking ceremony of the lych gate.

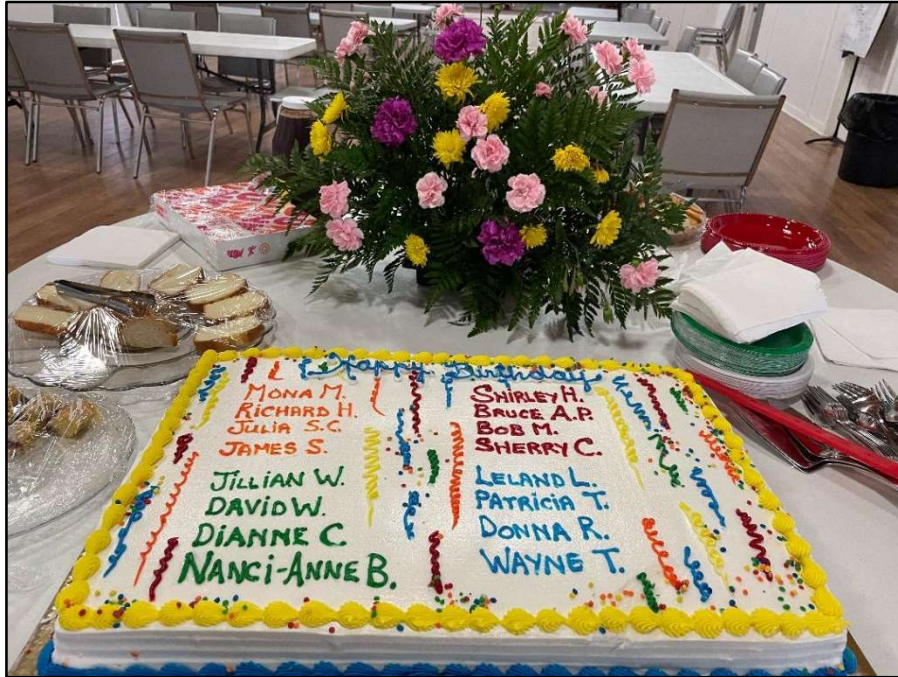

Holy Trinity Episcopal School is a Non-Profit Private School for Students who struggle to learn and make friends in a typical school environment. Students have Autism Spectrum Disorder, ADHD, ADD, Dyslexia or other learning disabilities. When our students graduate they are prepared for college, vocational schools or to set out into the working field.
