

Back to Church Season Has Arrived

Holy Trinity Episcopal School welcomed 45 students back to school on August 15. Mr. McCallister and his staff were delighted to see

the returning 7th through 12th graders, and are looking forward to getting to know the incoming 6th graders. The enrollment this year is the largest in the history of our school, which only five years ago had fewer than 30 students. The 6th grade, the Class of 2029, has an enrollment of six students who are currently navigating a new school, new friends, new teachers, and learning "The Holy Trinity Way".



In addition to the students, HTES sees a return of all of its staff, and welcomes two new teachers. Due to the nationwide teacher shortage, we are still in need of two additional teachers, and Mr. McCallister continues his search for the best teachers for our school.

Mr. McCallister has posted a second wish list in the parish hall if you are willing and able to assist us. 

The statue of Christ the Good Shepherd was erected in the Holy Trinity Cemetery in late 1966. It was dedicated in memory of Eleanor Frame who passed in 1965.

The statue was not purchased but was instead cast and sculpted by Gershon Bosanquet, a third generation member of one of the founding families of Holy Trinity. Gershon, or Go-Go as he was known to his friends, had worked on the project at his home for approximately a year.

He got his nickname from an Uncle who had



difficulty pronouncing Gershon but it really stuck when he played Quarterback for the Leesburg High School Football team in 1951.

Go-Go was elected to the Vestry and served as Senior Warden in 1967, 1989 and 1992.

The statue is now the center piece of the Cemetery. Cremains may be mixed with soil and placed around the base of the statue.
