2023 Annual Parish Meeting

In accordance with our by-laws the 2023 Annual Parish Meeting will be held on **Sunday January 29, 2023** following a combined worship service to be held at 9:30. We will elect 3 Vestry members to succeed those who have faithfully completed their 3-year terms. We will also elect one person to serve 1 year of an unexpired term.

The meeting is open to all active participants in the life and mission of Holy Trinity but only **Voting Members** will be eligible to vote or be considered for elective office. A voting member is:

- A confirmed (received) Episcopalian and recorded as such in the Parish Register. Confirmed Episcopalians who have not yet transferred their membership from their previous parish are not be eligible to vote until they do so.
- A confirmed Episcopalian 16 years and older
- A confirmed Episcopalian who for the previous year has been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and is faithful in working, praying, giving for the spread of God's Kingdom at Holy Trinity and beyond.

If you are not sure about your status, please contact the rector.

ESPORTS LEAGUE AT HTES

Justin McCallister, Head of School at Holy Trinity Episcopal School, has announced that our students will soon be competing in an ESports League. ESports, short for Electronic Sports, is a competition using various video games. Though these types of competitions have

been occurring nationally and internationally for several decades, this league is new for the state of Florida and HTES. All Florida schools, public and private, have been invited to participate in the new league, and our students are anxious to join.

Students will compete against other schools within the Orange County District, both as individuals and teams. Thus far approximately 20 middle and high school students have shown an interest in being part of the HTES team. After school practice will begin next week, with actual competition beginning in the spring. As with all team sports, students compete within their district and can eventually vie for the state championship.

Our team will initially use borrowed equipment (gaming specific monitors and PC's, and game consoles) for their practice sessions, but will soon need to purchase equipment for competitions. Mr. McCallister estimates that the initial cost of equipment will be \$2,000, with additional funds needed as the number of competitors grows and they advance in competitions.

This team is a first for HTES, as it allows our students to participate in extracurricular activities and compete against other schools in our area. More importantly it provides an opportunity to foster school spirit and develop team building skills. We wish our team well and look forward to hearing of their successes.
