

Invite, Welcome, Connect

By now many of us have heard about the "Dechurching" phenomena, either through the invitation to a recent event hosted by our bishop



at the Cathedral of St. Luke in Orlando, my recent sermon, or the various articles I have shared via our email hotline. According to a recent book by two Orlando based pastors, 40 million adults in the US who grew up going to

church have stopped going for various reasons over the past 25 years. The interesting part is that, moving to a new community, was the biggest reason why most people stopped going to church. On the other hand, of the 20 million who are willing to return to church, many of them are looking for opportunities to make new friends following a move to a new community.

As depressing the findings may seem, they also serve as inspiration for us as a church whose vision is to be a warm and welcoming Christ-centered community for all to belong, blossom and bless; and whose mission is to invite, welcome, and connect all people to God and one another in Christ. It is particularly encouraging

to know that we live in one of the fastest growing regions in the country, with thousands of people moving into our area every month. This means that we have a golden opportunity to invite, welcome and connect those who may be looking to reconnect with God and one another, following retirement and relocation.

Intentionality

I have every reason to believe that most, if not all, of us agree with both our vision and mission statements as stated above. Everyone I know at Holy Trinity agrees that we strive to be a warm and welcoming church and would like to see more people join us. Everyone agrees that we should be in the business of inviting, welcoming, and connecting people to God and one another. Indeed, for the most part, we seem to be abiding by our vision and mission statements. What I cannot determine is how intentional we are about our vision and mission. All I know is that it is very easy to have a great vision and mission statement on paper and very little in practice. That is why I suggest that every one of us becomes more intentional about our vision and mission. More often than not, members of churches with a vision and mission like ours expects someone else implement them. They expect certain people to be warm, welcoming, and Christ-centered. They hope that someone will invite, welcome, and connect newcomers to the church. Usually that work is left to a committee of a few people. While committees like our InviteWelcomeConnect team can play an important role of visioning and strategic planning, everyone needs to participate if we are to accomplish our mission.

Inviting

As we look forward to regular church programming, I pray that every one of us will be intentional about inviting someone to our worship and several other activities. Our upcoming Ministry Fair/Open House scheduled for Sunday October 1, will be an opportunity to invite someone you know is not currently going associated with a church. All we need to say is "Come and See." These three words were powerfully used to bring many to Jesus during his earthly ministry (John 1:39, 46).

Welcoming

Welcoming is particularly tricky because of the variety of visitors' personalities. While some guests may prefer to simply come and go, most guests who visit a small church expect to meet new people. The best way to be warm and welcoming is to say "hello" to everyone you see whether you know them or not. If you know their name, greet them by name, if you've seen them before but don't remember their name, simply say "Hello, good to see you gain. Please remind me your name." If you are not sure you've met the person before, simply say "Hello, Welcome! My name is Samuel. I am not sure we've met before." Most people will tell you whether they are visiting for the first time, whether they are new, or whether they are long term members who attend a different service. The goal is to make people feel welcome. Welcoming also involves inviting a guest to our Hospitality Hour following the 8 am and 10:30 am services in the Parish Hall. More importantly it involves encouraging them to grab something to drink or eat and sitting with them. One of the most embarrassing moments is to go into a Parish Hall and seeing a guest or guests sitting alone while regular members are busy chatting with their friends. Intentional welcoming involves paying attention to guests and ensuring their comfort.

Connecting

Connection may be as simple as introducing the guest to a few other people but more so about getting to know the person a little better. This usually happens at the second or third visit when you are sure the person is interested in becoming part of our church family. On a ministry team level, we usually invite regular guests to a newcomer gathering followed by an invitation to consider becoming a participating member which involves filling out a new member information form, being included in the directory and the email list, and an official welcome ceremony during the worship service. At that point, new members are invited to consider joining any ministry of their interest so they can begin to blossom and bless.

As we consider how we may be more intentional about inviting, welcoming, and connecting all people to God and one another, it is important to note that these principles are not linear but cyclical. We are constantly inviting, welcoming, and connecting to God and one another with hopes of achieving greater levels of belonging, blossoming, and blessing. We praise God for how far we've come and for the promise of more to come. May the Holy Spirit grant us the wisdom and grace to joyfully invite, welcome, and connect all people to God and one another in Christ.

August 2023

The Vestry met for their monthly meeting on Thursday, August 17, 2023 to discuss matters of importance to the life and mission of our church.

- 1. The Vestry reviewed the minutes from our meeting in June. The minutes were accepted.
- 2. The Vestry affirmed the following upcoming events, so please add these events to your calendar:
 - a. October 1st Ministry Fair
 - b. October 7th Blessing of Animal
 - c. October 7th Saturday Service at 4:15
 - d. October 8th Sunday School Resumes
 - e. October 21st School Golf Benefit at Harbor Hills
 - f. October 22nd Stewardship Campaign Begins
 - g. November 19th Consecration Sunday
- 3. The Vestry reflected on reports from the various ministry teams. Items discussed included:
 - a. Security cameras/system for the church, school and rectory...The task-force is waiting to receive another quote before a recommendation can be made.
 - b. New gutters all the way around the Parish were completed.
 - c. An AC unit in the church was repaired.
 - d. Two classrooms are in need of repair due to mold. The insurance company

has assessed the situation and we are waiting for a response. The siding on the old school building is being replaced. Once completed, a new ramp will be built on the East side of the building.

- 4. Fr. Samuel discussed the following topics in his Rector's Report
 - a. School Leadership Transition-The position of Interim Head of School has been posted online and in the local newspaper.

 O'Steen has been hired and began on Monday, August 21st.
 - c. Online Giving- currently on the website

- 6. The Vestry discussed the ways to hear ideas from parishioners concerning the church. It was decided that a written explanation in would be best. The ideas would be discussed at a Vestry meeting and the parishioner would be notified of the decision. When necessary, the parishioner would be invited to say more about the idea at a Vestry meeting. Also, our Vestry meetings are open to parishioners who may wish to attend. Vestry meetings are held on the 3rd Thursday of the month.

To ensure institutional and operational stability, I was asked by the school board to serve as Acting Head of School and appointed Mrs. Jeanne Nicolosi, the guidance counselor to serve as Acting Assistant Head of School.
