Come and See

"Philip found Nathanael and said to him, 'We have found him about whom Moses in the Law and also the Prophets wrote, Jesus son of Joseph from Nazareth.' Nathanael said to him, 'Can anything good come out of Nazareth?' Philip said to him, 'Come and see.'" (John 1:45-46).



One of the most lifechanging phrases in the Bible is "Come and See." When John the Baptist pointed to Jesus and proclaimed him to be "the Lamb of God who takes away the

sins of the world", two of his disciples followed Jesus and asked him where he was staying. He told them to "Come and See." After spending the day with him, they were so convinced that they came back to invite their relatives and friends. Among those invited was Nathanael who initially questioned whether anything good could come from the small town of Nazareth where Jesus was from, but agreed to go because Philip told him to simply "Come and See." After experiencing Jesus, Nathaniel never looked back and ended up becoming one of the twelve lead disciples (apostles). (John 1:35-51).

The Samaritans who responded to the Samaritan woman's invitation to come and see the man (Jesus) who had told her everything she had done were so impressed that they asked Jesus to stay in their village. After experiencing him for two days, they said to the woman, "It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Savior of the world." (John 4:29, 39-42).

These and several other stories demonstrate the power of a simple invitation to come and see. As I reflect on my own life journey, every life changing experience began with a response to a simple invitation. I believe it is true for most, if not, all of us. It could have been a visit to a college campus, a job fair, a blind date, etc. that set you off on a journey that has shaped your life.

As part of our shared mission as a church, we are strongly encouraged and expected to invite others to experience Jesus with us. Some of your relatives, friends or neighbors may wonder whether anything good could be happening at a small church, in the small town of Fruitland Park, with a priest who has a funny and hard to understand accent. You don't need to convince them but simply say "Come and See." course, not everyone will respond, and not everyone who responds will have a lifechanging experience. All I know is that if we invite them, some will come, and of those who come, some will experience the loving, liberating and life-giving Spirit of God at work in this place, and potentially choose to be part of our shared life and mission.

Research has shown that 85% of all visitors to a church come because they are invited. It also shows that 35% of all unchurched people are willing to visit a church if invited. Another interesting number is that every churchgoer knows at least 7 close relatives, friends, or neighbors who do not attend any church. It has also been said that on average 20% of first-time guests end up becoming part of the church. This means that if 30 of us invited all 7 (total 210) of our unchurched relatives, friends or neighbors, at least 73 of them would come, and possibly 14 of them would choose to become part of us. This in addition to those who find us online or local

newspapers would represent a significant growth of those who have an opportunity to belong, blossom and bless with us.

As we begin a very busy season of our shared life and mission, I encourage each one of us to simply invite people to come and see. Invite your relatives, friends or neighbors to come and see our Ministry Fair/Open House on Sunday October 1, our Blessing of Animals on October 7, our School Golf Benefit on October 21, our Christmas Services and most importantly our worship services on weekly afternoons, Sunday, and Wednesday mornings. I have every confidence that the Lord will work through your simple invitations to touch some's life and in-turn use them to touch another person's life.

May God grant us the grace to be like Andrew, Philip, the Samaritan woman and many others who have been used to invite others to experience the loving, liberating and life-giving message of God's love in Christ Jesus.

"I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the LORD!" ... For the sake of my relatives and friends I will say, "Peace be within you." For the sake of the house of the Lord our God, I will seek your good." (Psalm 122:1, 8-9).

Your Outreach Committee at HTEC has met and set our plans for the Ministries we will support during this last part of the year. We need the help of our Parishioners to bring our plans to fruition. Please stop by our Outreach Table during Ministry Sunday, October 1, to learn how you can help.

The Ministries that we plan to support;

- 1) **Salvation Army Angel Tree**, we will have a sign-up sheet for Parishioners to sign up if they are willing to take an Angel to shop for this year. This will let us know how many Angels to take from Salvation Army.
- 2) **Operation Christmas Child**, this year we are only asking for the shipping cost to ship these 50 shoeboxes, \$10.00 each. Our Outreach Committee has already purchased the items to go into each of our 50 Shoeboxes. We will have

envelopes for you to take if you want to support this Ministry.






