Advent: Already and Not Yet

The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them. ... They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain; for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea. (Isaiah 11:6-9).



The above words designated for the second Sunday of Advent in liturgical year A, point to a vision of the world that is yet to be realized. Indeed, the current events on the global scene seem to push the vision further into the realm of impossibility.

Advent is a season when we look back to God's fulfillment of His promises and look forward with hope to those promises not yet fulfilled. It is a time when we look forward to another celebration of what God has done and is doing in our midst; even as we eagerly await what God will do in the near and distant future. It is a time of hopeful expectation.

Throughout the season, we will read about both the prediction and the actual coming of Jesus of Nazareth as the promised Messiah. We will read about John the Baptist who urged the people to prepare the way of the Lord. Most importantly, we will learn what it

is like to prepare for the Lord's coming into our own situations.

We will once again be reminded that, like those who expected the Messiah to free them from the oppressive socio-economic and political systems of their time, Jesus is more interested in freeing us from the things that separate us from God and one another. We will be reminded that fixing what many consider our unjust or corrupt social, economic, and political systems begins with each one of us developing a right relationship with God and one another.

That is exactly what John the Baptist meant when he challenged those who came to be baptized in preparation for the coming Messiah, to produce fruit worthy of their repentance (Luke 3:8-14). It is about persevering in resisting evil and whenever we fall repent and return to the Lord. It is about continuing in the apostles teaching, the prayers, and the breaking of bread. It is about proclaiming the good news by word and example, seeking and serving Christ in all persons, striving for justice and peace among all people and respecting the dignity of every human being.

The message of Advent for all of us who expectantly wait for God to intervene in our personal and corporate situations is that God is faithful and will do what He has promised (Hebrews 10:23). It is also an invitation for us to be faithful in preparing the way, removing the things that hinder God's intervention in our situations.

As I think about the meaning and significance of Advent, I realize that we at Holy Trinity do not just practice Advent during the four weeks of Advent on the liturgical calendar, but we practice Advent all year round. We are a people who are grateful for what God has done and look forward to more. Most importantly, we do not simply wait in expectation for God's intervention, but we actively prepare the way in word and action.

This work of preparing the way of the Lord has most recently been demonstrated through your generous contributions of time, talent, and funds for various activities including, but not limited to, the recordbreaking Golf benefit for our school, donations to purchase wreaths for the 73 veterans in our cemetery, donations to Operation Christmas Child, bell ringing for Salvation Army, Salvation Army Christmas Angels, and perhaps most significant, the ongoing

response to our annual Stewardship Campaign. God is truly at work in us, and through us, many hopes and dreams are being realized.

May this Advent be for you a time to once again "Fling wide the portals of your heart; make it a temple, set apart from earthly use for heaven's employ, adorned with prayer and love and joy." Hymn 436 – Hymnal 1982

Vestry Meeting Highlights

November 2023

The Vestry met for the monthly meeting on Thursday, November 9, 2023 to discuss matters of importance to the life and mission of our church.

- 1. The Vestry reviewed and approved the October Vestry meeting minutes.
- 2. The Junior Warden reported that:
 - a. the school was notified of the plan to install a security system for the school to be paid for by the church.
 - b. the siding on the school and church office buildings have been replaced. Now the siding needs painting.
 - c. a lift will be needed to repair the lightning rods on the church as well as a light by the Altar and repairs for the stained-glass window above the church doorway.
- 3. The Vestry was updated on the upcoming events which include:
 - a. January 27th Diocesan Convention-Our 3 delegates from the Vestry will be Mandy, Bob and John. 3 alternate delegates are needed. If interested, please talk to Fr. Samuel.
 - b. January 28th Annual Parish Meeting
- 4. Fr. Samuel informed the Vestry that:
 - a. nominations are open to fill 3 positions, each for a 3-year term, on the Vestry. These terms will begin in January 2024.
 - b. the HTES Golf Benefit was an amazing success.
 - c. the InviteWelcomeConnect team would like to have events that would excite and involve parishioners in its mission.
 - d. Pastoral Care is looking for advocates to serve as primary contacts for those who are homebound.

- 5. The Vestry unanimously voted to appoint Judy Gygi to serve as Assistant Treasurer in charge of Altar Guild finances, and Joan Ballard as co-signer to the Church's Altar Guild bank account.
- 6. The Vestry reviewed and approved the Treasurer's report as amended.
- 7. The Vestry reviewed and discussed the preliminary budget draft for 2024.

Vestry Elections 2024

At our Annual Parish Meeting on Sunday January 28, 2024, we will need to elect three individuals to fill one vacant position and to replace two current occupants who have completed their terms and are ineligible for re-election. The two vestry members will complete their three-year terms in January. We are therefore seeking candidates for the above positions that will become vacant in January 2024.

What is a Vestry?

A Vestry is a body of elected congregational leaders. Congregations that have been granted parish status by their diocese are governed by their rector and the vestry. 'Traditionally, and by canon law, the vestry, consisting of wardens and other members, is the legal representative of the parish "in all matters concerning its corporate property and the relations of the Parish to its Clergy," except as may be provided by state law or diocesan canons (Constitution & Canons of the Episcopal Church, 1.14.2.). The number of vestry members and term of office varies from parish to parish.

Most vestries have the following officers:

The Presiding Officer is the rector.

There are usually two wardens. The senior warden traditionally chairs the vestry in the absence of the rector and leads the congregation between rectors. In many parishes the senior warden is a support person for the rector. The junior warden often has a particular responsibility for church property and buildings.

A treasurer and secretary or clerk who may or may not be vestry members, may be chosen. The treasurer deposits and disburses funds and oversees financial record keeping. The secretary keeps the minutes, gives notices of meetings to the parish and maintains vestry records. Some vestries have an Executive Committee of the rector, wardens, treasurer and committee chairs. They oversee implementation of decisions and plan the agenda.

The responsibility of the vestry, like that of the governing body of any organization, is to:

- Help define and articulate the mission of the congregation;
- Support the mission by word and deed;
- Ensure effective organization and planning;
- Ensure adequate resources in leadership and in financial stewardship;
- Manage resources effectively;
- Determine that appropriate programs, policies, and procedures have been developed and are followed;
- Assess its own performance.

Though the vestry has some similarities to a board of directors, it is important to remember that this ministry of leadership is exercised in the church. The success of a congregation is not measured in terms of numbers of members or size of the endowment, but rather in the degree to which it is working toward the fulfillment of the mission of the church.

Responsibilities of Individual Members of the Vestry

- Regularly prepare for, attend, and participate in vestry meetings;
- Learn about the mission, goals, programs, services, activities, strengths, and needs of the congregation, diocese, and national church;
- Maintain confidentiality on sensitive topics;
- Serve the congregation as a whole rather than any specific group;
- Encourage complainants to talk directly with the person(s) involved; avoid taking sides; inform rector or senior warden of serious concerns:

From the Vestry Resource Guide by the Episcopal Church Foundation 1997

A Candidate for vestry must be:

- A committed Christian who acknowledges Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior of his or her life.
- An active voting member of Holy Trinity's parish for at least two years.
- One who understands the vision and mission of Holy Trinity and is willing to promote it in

- word and action among other members and the community at large.
- One who supports the life and mission of Holy Trinity by sharing his time, talent and treasure
- One who is involved in one or more ministry teams
- One who is a good example in financial stewardship and generosity
- One who is willing to commit to one or more monthly vestry meetings and at least one annual training/retreat event
- One who is willing to provide leadership in every other aspect of our church life and mission.
