New Year. On the other hand, there may be feelings of regret, discontent, and sometimes a sense of guilt for things not accomplished, coupled with a sense of anxiety about the future. I wonder how you feel about the past year and what your hopes or fears are for 2024.

For me, this third year as your rector was wonderful in many ways. I continue to be amazed at how wonderful you, the people of Holy Trinity are, and how blessed I am to serve our Lord with you. And so, I end 2023, filled with a great sense of gratitude, contentment, and joy; and begin 2024 with a greater sense of hope and excitement about our shared life and mission.

Because of your dedication and commitment demonstrated by your generosity of time, talent, and treasure, we were able to accomplish so much in 2023. Our buildings and grounds are in much better shape than they were at the beginning of the year. Our historic sanctuary and our parish/office building received much needed new roofing. A leaking roof on one of the new school buildings which caused some damage and displaced two classrooms has been repaired and the students are back in their classrooms. Several parts of the school and office buildings that needed new siding have received it. Beyond that, we were able to raise around \$35,000 for our school through our annual school golf benefit. The response to our annual stewardship campaign is another testimony to your dedication to God's work in this place.

Beyond our campus, we were able to respond to the needs of so many. We honored our commitment to the Sao Paulo Mercy Ministry which ministers to the homeless population in the city of Sao Paulo, Brazil, we continue to financially support Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD) efforts across the globe, Operation Christmas Child, etc. More importantly, we continue to respond to the needs of the less fortunate in our community, particularly through our partnership with local agencies such as Salvation Army and the Leesburg Food Bank. We are literally proclaiming God's love locally, nationally and globally. To God be the glory!

Among the many blessings of the past year, are the many new people God has added to our number. Many of them came to us with gifts and a passion to serve the Lord and already having an impact. I pray they will find Holy Trinity to be truly the place to belong, blossom, and bless; as they join us in inviting, welcoming, and connecting others to God and one another in Christ.

Like any other year, this year was not without its challenges. I am particularly reminded of those among us for whom the past year was very difficult and those whose struggles continue through the New Year. This past year was particularly difficult for those of our members who lost their loved ones and those who are dealing with illness or caring for family members who are ill. Others of us might have had financial or relationship issues. Whether you had a good or a bad year, I hope God's grace was sufficient to carry you through each day. As a church, I can say that our challenges were few but significant. The sudden departure of our Head of School came as a surprise. Fortunately, due to the

Vestry Meeting Highlights

December 14, 2023

The Vestry met for their monthly meeting on Thursday, December 14, 2023 to discuss matters of importance to the life and mission of our church.

- 1. The Vestry reviewed and approved the November meeting minutes as submitted.
- 2. The Vestry discussed the upcoming Annual Parish Meeting scheduled for Sunday January 28, 2023 and agreed on the following:
 - a. The theme of the annual meeting will be "Celebration of Generosity" in thanksgiving for our generosity of time, talent, and treasure in support of God's mission in this place.
 - b. There will be one Sunday worship service at 9:30 am to accommodate members who attend either service. The Saturday service will be offered for those for whom the 9:30am may be an inconvenience.
 - c. There will be a celebration luncheon at 11:00 a.m. in the Parish Hall. The luncheon will be paid for from the church budget. All are welcome.
 - d. The business session will begin at 11:45 am.
- 3. The Junior Warden reported that:

- a. The security system for the school will be installed during the Christmas break.
- b. Carpenters for Christ (a local Christian volunteer group) will install a new ramp at the back of the school in January.
- 4. The Vestry discussed the need for a handicapped bathroom and decided to further explore the possibility as a matter of priority.
- 5. Fr. Samuel reported that:
 - a. A Newcomer/Confirmation Class will begin sometime in February with a possible confirmation in the Spring of 2024.
 - b. So far there are no candidates for the 3 open positions effective January 28, 2024
- 6. The Vestry reviewed and approved the treasurer's report for November.
- 7. The Vestry voted to approve the 2024 Budget of \$344,700.00 as proposed by the Finance Committee for 2024.

Vestry Elections 2024

At our Annual Parish Meeting on Sunday January 28, 2024, we will need to elect three individuals to fill one vacant position and to replace two current occupants who have completed their terms and are ineligible for re-election. The two vestry members will complete their three-year terms in January. We are therefore seeking candidates for the above positions that will become vacant in January 2024.

What is a Vestry?

A Vestry is a body of elected congregational leaders. Congregations that have been granted parish status by their diocese are governed by their rector and the vestry. 'Traditionally, and by canon law, the vestry, concerning its corporate property and the relations of the Parish to its Clergy," except as may be provided by state law or diocesan canons (Constitution & Canons of the Episcopal Church, 1.14.2.). The number of vestry members and term of office varies from parish to parish.

Most vestries have the following officers:

The Presiding Officer is the rector.

There are usually two wardens. The senior warden traditionally chairs the vestry in the absence of the rector and leads the congregation between rectors. In many parishes the senior warden is a support person for the rector. The junior warden often has a particular responsibility for church property and buildings.

A treasurer and secretary or clerk who may or may not be vestry members, may be chosen. The treasurer deposits and disburses funds and oversees financial record keeping. The secretary keeps the minutes, gives notices of meetings to the parish and maintains vestry records.

Some vestries have an Executive Committee of the rector, wardens, treasurer and committee chairs. They oversee implementation of decisions and plan the agenda.

The responsibility of the vestry, like that of the governing body of any organization, is to:

- Help define and articulate the mission of the congregation;
- Support the mission by word and deed;
- Ensure effective organization and planning;
- Ensure adequate resources in leadership and in financial stewardship;
- Manage resources effectively;
- Determine that appropriate programs, policies, and procedures have been developed and are followed:
- Assess its own performance.

Though the vestry has some similarities to a board of directors, it is important to remember that this ministry of leadership is exercised in the church. The success of a congregation is not measured in terms of numbers of members or size of the endowment, but rather in the degree to which it is working toward the fulfillment of the mission of the church.

Responsibilities of Individual Members of the Vestry

- Regularly prepare for, attend, and participate in vestry meetings;
- Learn about the mission, goals, programs, services, activities, strengths, and needs of the congregation, diocese, and national church;
- Maintain confidentiality on sensitive topics;

- Serve the congregation as a whole rather than any specific group;
- Encourage complainants to talk directly with the person(s) involved; avoid taking sides; inform rector or senior warden of serious concerns;
