



The Culture of Invitation



Almost all Episcopal Churches I know have a sign, a sticker, or something else that says: **"The Episcopal Church Welcomes You."** Many of them actually do a good job of making visitors feel welcome while many others don't. I have seen both. Based on what I hear

from many of our new members and visitors, Holy Trinity is a welcoming church.

With such a positive reputation, one would expect a lot more people in our pews on Sunday mornings and our other events. The fact that there are only a few of us, suggests that there are other things we may not be doing as well. I believe one of the things we need to be more intentional about is invitation. Being a welcoming church is good but of little help if there are no visitors to welcome; and visitors will not visit unless they are invited.

According to statistics:

- 82% of the un-churched are at least somewhat likely to attend church if invited
- 75 90% of new church members started coming because they were invited by someone who attends the church

10 – 30% of first-time visitors will eventually become members

Why invite others to Church?

The simple answer is that it is what Christians are called to do. It is very clear that the Christian movement began when Jesus invited two of John the Baptist's disciples to "Come and See". We are told that one of those disciples was Andrew. The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother, Simon Peter, and tell him, "We have found the Messiah." He brought him to Jesus. The next day Jesus found Phillip to whom he said, "Follow Me". Phillip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law ... Jesus of Nazareth. the son of Joseph." When Nathanael asked whether anything good could come from Nazareth, Phillip answered, "Come and See." (John 1:39-46). This and numerous other examples in the Bible and people's own experiences throughout history, clearly show that the church or any other organization can only exist if members make it a habit to invite others.

While I must admit that inviting others to church is easier said than done, the biggest obstacle has been the loss of "the culture of invitation." Somehow, we have concluded that what is good for us is not necessarily good for others and have decided to keep it to ourselves. Faith, in particular, has become a private matter instead of something beautiful to which everyone is invited and welcome to "**taste and see.**"

How to invite someone to Church?

There are certainly many ways to invite someone to church. I personally find the following steps developed over ten years ago by the Rev. Scott Thompson and members of St. James Episcopal Church in Mosinee, Wisconsin, to be very helpful.

1) Make a list of everyone you know that you could possibly invite to Holy Trinity (family, friends, colleagues, neighbors, etc). Anyone not regularly involved in a church should be invited. Some people have their membership at a church, but seldom (if ever) attend. Obviously, whatever that church has to offer, it is not making an impact on that particular individual. Perhaps God would use you and Holy Trinity to make an impact and bring that person's faith to life! You'll never know until you care enough to extend an invitation. 2) <u>Work the list and pray</u>. Go for it. Talk to someone. Give someone a call. And before you talk to people, talk to God about the people he is leading you to invite. Pray that he will give you the right words to say. Pray that he will put your spirit at ease. (Some people get nervous talking to others about church.) Pray that he will open the hearts of those you invite.

3) <u>Share what Holy Trinity means to you</u>. No advertisement is as effective as a satisfied "customer." You may want to sit down and think about what Holy Trinity means to you and put it into your own words. Then when it's clear in your own mind, share what you feel with others.

4) Make a specific invitation. "Join us sometime" is too open ended. That's like saying "Come over to dinner sometime." The invitee doesn't know whether he/she is really being invited or not. So be specific. Example: "I'm going to Holy Trinity this Sunday and I would love for you to join me." If they can't make it, they will say so, and you can invite them again another time. If they say they are already a member at another church, ask them how often they go or how involved they are. If they are really committed to that other church, take them off your list. If they are not really committed, continue to invite them, unless it becomes obvious that they are averse to your asking. Don't give up too easily, but don't be obnoxious. People need the Lord, and some people need a loving friend who will take an interest in their spiritual needs. That's why Holy Trinity exists. And you are Christ's hands to reach out to those people. If you don't reach out, who will?

5) Provide the transportation. Include in your invitation your intention provide to the transportation. Example: "I'm going to Holy Trinity this Sunday, and I would love for you to join me... It starts at 10:30; I'll pick you up at 9:45!" If they know you are coming to get them, they will have to be ready, and sleeping in or not going will be less tempting. You yourself might be tempted to think that such an approach is being a little "pushy." Your friend might even think that too. BUT, if they come with you to church and find their faith and the joy that is gained in a new relationship with God through Jesus Christ. they will be forever grateful that you took the time and effort to get them to church. So go ahead, be bold, bold as love, and reach out!

As we approach Holy Week and Easter, this may be a wonderful opportunity for you to invite the friend, neighbor, or relative who has no church connection. It is my hope that as we pray and practice these things, we will one day be known not just for our welcoming but for our invitation as well.

Vestry Meeting Highlights February 15, 2024

The Vestry met for their monthly meeting on Thursday, February 15, 2024 to discuss matters of importance to the life and mission of our church.

1. The Vestry reviewed the January meeting minutes and were accepted as amended.

2. The returning Vestry members met for the first time with new Vestry members. It was a time of orientation for both new and old members. Items discussed during this time included:

- 1. Legal documents such as the Parish By-laws and the National Cannons
- 2. The Vestry Resource Guide and other reference resources
- 3. An Annual Calendar which would include our Annual Vestry retreat
- 3 <u>Please Note</u>: The Vestry unanimously voted to change the Vestry Meetings from 6:30 PM to 6:00 PM on the third Thursday of each month.
- 4 The Junior Warden reported that:
 - a. The round window, above the church door, should be fixed shortly.

b. A Building and Grounds Clean-up Day will take place on March 2, 2024. Remember the old adage, **"Many hands make light work."**

- 5 Fr. Samuel's Rector's Report included the following:
 - a. The Vestry unanimously approved the **Diocesan Assessment** for 2024.
 - b. The **Parochial Report** was presented and unanimously accepted by the Vestry.
 - c. The Vestry unanimously approved a small gift, in a good faith gesture, for an ad in **Holy Faith's Celebration** brochure.

- 6 The Vestry reviewed and approved the treasurer's report for January. In addition, time was spent explaining each of the types of reports that are issued each month for the Vestry members review and discussion
- 7 The next Vestry Meeting is March 21st.
- 8 The meeting ended with a closing prayer from Fr. Samuel.
